

SCHOLARSHIPS AVAILABLE

Hesston Recreation is pleased to offer scholarship opportunities based on the following policy:

Those on free or reduced-price lunches through USD 460 are eligible for a 50 percent scholarship. Those on KanCare Insurance will receive a 100 percent scholarship. There is a \$75-perchild limit per fiscal year. Our fiscal years run July 1 through June 30 of the following year. No scholarships will be offered on pool passes. Proof of KanCare Insurance will be requested.

LATE REGISTRATION POLICY

Registrations submitted after the registration deadline will be assessed a \$10 late fee. Late registrations are accepted based on space availability in the activity. Families that recently relocated to USD 460 will be exempt from the late fee.

SWIM LESSON CLASS DESCRIPTIONS

- Level 0 ages 3-5 (preschool) 30 minutes
 - * submerge mouth, nose and eyes
 - * retrieve submerged objects
 - * front and back glide
 - * roll from front to back
 - * simultaneous and alternating kicks
 - * simultaneous and alternating arms
 - * staying safe around water

Level 2 - Fundamental Aquatic Skills - 45 minutes

- * floats, front, jellyfish and tuck
- * tread water using arm and leg actions 15 seconds
- * rotary breathing
- * kicks, dolphin, elementary backstroke and flutter
- * swim with combined arms/legs for 10 yards
- * move in the water wearing a life jacket

Level 4 - Stroke Improvement - 45 minutes

- * dive from stride position
- * tread water for 2 minutes (different leg kicks)
- * 25 yards of front crawl and elementary backstroke
- * 15 yards of back crawl, breaststroke and butterfly
- * open turns for back and front crawl
- * sidestroke introduction
- * throwing assist

Level 6 - Fundamentals of Diving - 50 minutes

- * 100 yards of freestyle & elementary backstroke
- * 50 yards of backcrawl and breaststroke
- * 50 yards of sidestroke and butterfly
- * surface dive and retrieve object
- * swim 500 yards continuously
- * two part take off from the board, headfirst and feetfirst
- * dangers of extended breath- holding

- Level 1 Introduction to Water Skills 30 minutes
 - * bob at least 5 times
 - * glide at least 5 yards & recover to a vertical position
 - * arm and hand treading actions
 - * combined arm and leg actions on front and back
 - * use of a life jacket
- Level 3 Stroke Development 45 minutes
 - * jump, sit dive and knee dive into deep water
 - * back float and survival float
 - * tread water for 1 minute
 - * streamline with dolphin and flutter kicks
 - * front crawl (freestyle) for 15 yards
 - * elementary backstroke for 15 yards
 - * reach assist and cold water survival
- Level 5 Stroke Refinement 45 minutes
 - * pike and surface dives
 - * freestyle and backstroke flip turns
 - * 50 yards freestyle and elementary backstroke
 - * 25 yards of breastroke, backstroke, and butterfly
 - * tread water 5 minutes, 2 minutes legs only
 - * standing dive
 - * review of all water safety concepts

Junior Lifeguarding - offered fall 2018 PREREQUISITES

- * front crawl 25 yds breathing to side or front
- * breaststroke 25 yrds using pull, breathe, kick, glide
- * Water Competency Sequence
- ** tread for 1 minute
- ** rotate one full turn
- ** swim 25 yards and exit without ladder or steps
